

<p><b>Aim:</b> To know about the responsible use of mobile phones: safe keeping (looking after it) and safe user habits (time limits, the use of passcode, turning it off at night, etc.)</p> <p>To know and use strategies for keeping safe online; the importance of protecting personal information, including passwords, addresses and the distribution of images of themselves and others.</p> <p>To understand personal boundaries; to identify what they are willing to share with their most special people; friends; classmates and others; and that we all have rights to privacy.</p> <p>To know how to manage requests for images of themselves or others; what is and is not appropriate to ask for or share; who to talk to if they feel uncomfortable or are concerned by such a request.</p>	<p>I can explain how to look after a mobile device and use it responsibly.</p> <p>I can describe a range of strategies to use to keep safe online.</p> <p>I can understand that everyone has the right to privacy and that some things must never be shared online.</p> <p>I can understand how to use mobile devices and the Internet safely and responsibly.</p>

<p>Is it OK to post your address online to a friend you know from school?</p> <p>Is it OK for your parent or carer to put a photo of you in your school uniform online, with your name underneath it?</p> <p>Is it OK to upload a photo of your friend that you took on your phone to the Internet?</p> <p>Is it OK for someone to request an image of you in your underwear?</p> <p>Is it OK to tell the children in your class your password for a chat site you belong to?</p>	
<p>A child at school is telling their friends all about someone they have been chatting to online recently and says that they have arranged to meet at a nearby park.</p>	

A couple of children are sending nasty, unkind emails to some of the children in their class. They think it is funny. Some of the children who receive the emails open them and are upset.

A group of children at the park are videoing a child in the year below. They say they are going to post the video online, which makes the child upset.

A couple of children start a nasty rumour about another child in their class, which they send in a text message to other children, telling them to pass it on. Some children who receive the text decide to take action.
