PE, Sport and Physical Activity Analysis 2025–2026

This academic year has been another highly successful year for PE, sport and physical activity at Spilsby Primary Academy. Building on the strong provision established last year, we have continued to broaden the range of activities available, increase participation and provide pupils with opportunities to develop their confidence, teamwork, resilience and sporting skills.

Last year's review highlighted the importance of offering an inclusive range of clubs, competitions and specialist coaching alongside a strong PE curriculum. It also set out our ambition to extend the variety of sports available to pupils. This year, we have successfully built upon these foundations.

Partnership with the School Games Organiser

We have continued to work closely with our local School Games Organiser to identify competitions, festivals and participation opportunities that meet the needs of pupils across the school.

- This partnership has helped us to:
- provide opportunities for pupils from different year groups to represent the school;
- offer both competitive and participation-focused events;
- introduce pupils to new and less familiar sports;
- develop links with other local schools;
- ensure our provision remains inclusive and aligned with the School Games values.

The support, advice and opportunities provided through the School Games network have played an important part in strengthening our sporting offer.

School Games Gold Mark

We are delighted to have achieved the School Games Gold Mark for the second consecutive year. This recognises the breadth and quality of our PE, sport and physical activity provision, as well as the commitment of our pupils and staff.

Achieving Gold for a second year demonstrates that high-quality sporting provision is now firmly embedded across the school. It reflects:

- sustained participation in competitions and festivals;
- an inclusive approach to physical activity;
- a broad extracurricular programme;
- strong partnerships with coaches and external organisations;
- opportunities for pupils to develop leadership, teamwork and resilience.
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We are now making strong progress towards achieving the Platinum School Games Mark. Our focus will be on sustaining our Gold-level provision over time, continuing to increase participation and ensuring that the impact of sport is evident across the whole school community.



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Competitions and Festivals

Pupils have represented Spilsby Primary Academy with enthusiasm, pride and excellent sportsmanship at a wide range of events this year.

Opportunities have included:

- Year 3 and 4 Mixed Football Tournament in Horncastle
- Year 1 and 2 Multisport Tournament
- Year 3 and 4 Dodgeball Tournament in Horncastle
- Year 5 and 6 Girls' Football Tournament in Horncastle
- Year 5 and 6 Boys' Football Tournament in Horncastle

These events have enabled pupils to experience competitive sport in a positive and supportive environment. Pupils have developed their understanding of rules, teamwork, communication and fair play while learning how to respond appropriately to both success and disappointment.

The mixed football and multisport events have been particularly valuable in promoting participation and allowing pupils to apply skills developed during curriculum PE lessons.

Key Stage 2 Sporting Opportunities

Key Stage 2 pupils have taken part in a broad programme of multisport activities, including:

- sports hall athletics;
- racket sports;
- cricket;
- netball;
- football;
- dodgeball;
- Kin-Ball.

This variety has helped pupils develop transferable skills such as agility, balance, coordination, accuracy and tactical awareness. It has also allowed children to discover activities they may not previously have experienced.

Providing a broad range of sports has supported our aim of ensuring that physical activity is accessible and enjoyable for all pupils, not only those who already participate in traditional team sports.



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Specialist Coaching

Specialist coaches have supported the delivery of cricket and netball sessions.

The cricket sessions have developed pupils' throwing, catching, batting and fielding skills, alongside their understanding of teamwork and game situations.

The netball sessions have focused on passing, movement, positioning, communication and applying rules during competitive play.

Working with specialist coaches has:

- increased pupils' technical knowledge;
- provided positive sporting role models;
- supported staff development;
- improved pupil confidence;
- introduced clear pathways into community sport.
- The enthusiasm and expertise of the coaches have helped pupils remain active, engaged and motivated.

Extracurricular Provision

Our extracurricular programme has continued to offer pupils opportunities to be active outside curriculum lessons.

Clubs have included:

- Kin-Ball after-school club
- Year 3 and 4 dodgeball club
- multisport activities;
- racket sports;
- football and team games.

Kin-Ball has been an exciting addition to the school's provision. Its inclusive and cooperative nature has encouraged pupils to communicate, work together and ensure that every member of the team is involved.

The Year 3 and 4 dodgeball club has also been popular, helping pupils develop agility, accuracy, spatial awareness and decision-making. The club provided valuable preparation for the Horncastle tournament and gave pupils the confidence to represent the school.

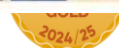

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Inclusion and Participation

A key priority has been to ensure that sport and physical activity are accessible to as many pupils as possible.

The range of provision has included opportunities for:

- younger pupils experiencing competition for the first time;
- girls and boys participating in separate and mixed football events;
- pupils who enjoy non-traditional sports such as Kin-Ball;
- pupils developing confidence before representing the school;
- children who may not regularly access sport outside school.

The Year 1 and 2 multisport tournaments provided an important early introduction to school sport. Pupils were able to experience new activities in a fun and supportive environment, helping to develop positive attitudes towards physical activity from an early age.

Impact on Pupils

Our sporting provision has contributed positively to pupils' wider development. Through PE lessons, coaching, clubs and competitions, pupils have developed:

- confidence and self-belief;
- teamwork and communication;
- resilience and perseverance;
- respect for rules and officials;
- pride in representing the school;
- an understanding of healthy and active lifestyles.

Sport continues to support our school values. Pupils demonstrate **honesty** through fair play, **love** through supporting teammates, **curiosity** when learning new sports, **hope** through setting personal goals and **unity** when working together.

Pupils have represented Spilsby Primary Academy exceptionally well. Their positive behaviour, encouragement of others and willingness to try new activities have been as important as their sporting performances.

- providing boys', girls' and mixed sporting opportunities;
- introducing a wider variety of activities;
- using specialist coaches to enhance cricket and netball provision;
- connecting curriculum learning, clubs and competitive events;
- promoting inclusion, teamwork and positive sporting value.

Priorities for 2026–2027

Next year, we will continue to build on this strong provision by:

1. Working towards the Platinum School Games Mark.
2. Increasing participation among pupils who do not regularly attend sports clubs.
3. Continuing to offer a balance of competitive and inclusive participation events.
4. Expanding opportunities for pupil leadership within PE and sport.
5. Strengthening links with local sports clubs and community providers.
6. Continuing to use specialist coaches to enhance provision and staff confidence.
7. Maintaining a broad extracurricular programme that includes both traditional and alternative sports.

This has been another excellent year for PE, sport and physical activity at Spilsby Primary Academy. Pupils have embraced new opportunities, represented the school with pride and demonstrated outstanding teamwork, enthusiasm and sportsmanship.

Our second consecutive School Games Gold Mark reflects the sustained commitment of pupils, staff, coaches and partners. We are proud of the progress that has been made and are well placed to continue developing our provision as we work towards Platinum.
